The fourth installment of Orlando's little film festival that could, the Global Peace Film Festival, arrives today. In seven days, 66 movies, short and full-length films, documentaries and features, will be shown at venues throughout town. The festival stands tall as the second-biggest film festival in Central Florida and one well worth taking in this year.

This festival spans the globe, with films on everything from wetlands protection to the bushmen of the Kalahari, the role of dissent in society and an epic remembrance of a politically charged and bloody Olympic water-polo match. The broad umbrella criterion for movies about "the path to peace" remains. The festival now travels from Orlando to other places, such as Cyprus, New York City, Los Angeles and Beppu city in Japan, says festival director Nina Streich.

Roger Moore's highlight:

Freedom's Fury (***)** The bloody 1956 Olympic water-polo match between new water-polo power the Soviet Union and the just-invaded satellite state (and traditional water-polo power) Hungary is remembered, vividly, by the men who played it. This terrific documentary is both a Hungarian Revolution history lesson and a play to acquire a new respect for one of the most difficult Olympic sports. Mark Spitz narrates.
